

# **Glynwood Vegetable Apprentice**

Job Title: Vegetable Apprentice

Regular Work Hours: March 13 - December 15, 2023. Position is 40-50 hrs/week M-F with

rotating weekend chores. Start times vary by season.

and a 40% discount on Glynwood meat and Glynwood Farm Store products.

Paid Time off: Apprentices earn 6 vacation days and 3 sick days.

**Overview:** Glynwood's Vegetable Apprenticeship Program is designed for those who are eager to pursue a career growing vegetables and have already experienced farm-scale vegetable production, preferably 1 to 3 seasons. Apprentices will have the opportunity to gain a solid foundation in all the skills necessary to manage a small-scale commercial organic vegetable operation. Beyond gaining hands-on experience and learning technical skills through working as a field crew on Glynwood's 7 acre vegetable farm, apprentices learn management skills through a variety of approaches including in-field training and explanations from experienced mentors, classroom workshops led by outside experts, in-field lessons covering farm production systems, and rotations through specific management roles. From tractor operation to business planning, compost production to crop rotations, the 9-month Vegetable Apprenticeship aims to provide a comprehensive overview of how to manage a vegetable farm.

Glynwood's Apprenticeship program will ask a lot of you. Apprentices work full-time on the vegetable team, participate in a 60-hour classroom curriculum, attend farm tours through the Mid Hudson Collaborative Regional Alliance for Farmer Training (CRAFT; some are optional, while some are required), complete regular assessments of their skills and progress towards program goals, and are encouraged to participate in Glynwood-led events, networks, and other programs. Apprentices are also expected to support Glynwood's culture of philanthropy and may be asked to contribute to story-telling projects or events led by our development and communications team.

**Job Summary:** Apprentices collaborate closely with their supervisors as a team, discussing work priorities and decisions throughout the season. The following job duties encompass the day-to-day work of the vegetable team and are also the core competencies apprentices can expect to learn.

### **Essential Job Duties**

- Greenhouse seeding and management
- Transplanting and direct seeding
- Hand weeding, hoeing, and cultivating
- Harvesting
- Washing and packing
- Cover cropping
- Mulching
- Pruning and trellising
- Irrigating
- Pest and disease control
- Field tractor work
- Record keeping
- Supervising CSA pickups
- Compost Making
- Machine and tool maintenance

**Educational Opportunities:** The apprentices are expected to participate in bi-weekly educational programs and other educational activities, including directed readings, occasional evening presentations, and farm visits.

- Attend more than 60 hours of educational and practical skills workshop in topics including:
  - o Cover cropping
  - o Pest and disease management
  - o Business planning
  - o Soil science
  - o Tractor safety and mechanization
  - o Small engine safety and mechanization
  - o Food access and food justice
  - o Basic carpentry
  - o Marketing
- Participate in skills assessment process to evaluate / improve skills
- Participate in Mid-Hudson Collaborative Regional Alliance for Farmer Training (CRAFT)
- Access organizational contacts for long-term networking assistance

## **Physical Demands**

This is a physically active role. The Vegetable Apprentice must be able and willing to:

• Stand, crouch, kneel, and bend

- Lift and move flats, materials, hoses, etc.
- Lift 50 pounds on a regular basis
- Perform other physical activities as needed for producing vegetables
- Work steadily outdoors in all weather including heat, cold, rain, and wind. (Working outdoors is not required when conditions are hazardous to human health.)

### **Weekend Work and Travel**

- Apprentices are required to participate in the vegetable team's weekend chore rotation, which will include performing field irrigation responsibilities and greenhouse care.
- Because required work hours increase with the season, some weekend work may be scheduled.
- Apprentices participate in field trips off site, and may attend one or more conferences that require overnight stays.

## **Supervisory Responsibility**

 When volunteers join us in the fields, apprentices may be asked to supervise and guide them.

# Required Education and Experience

- High school diploma or GED
- Must have some farming experience, such as one year's employment or an internship on a farm

## **Additional Eligibility Qualifications**

- Affinity for Glynwood's mission
- Valid US Driver License in good standing
- Provable eligibility to work in the US
